

All projects should be child made!

Each project must go along with a book read during the month of that project.

August ____	Make a mobile describing your book. Select an item to which string can be attached. (hangers, wooden rods, etc.) Illustrate scenes, characters, or chapters from the book on sturdy paper. You must have at least 4 items and be large enough to be visible when hanging. Be creative!
September ____	Design a book mark. Be creative! Use a variety of materials. Bookmarks should promote reading or a particular book you have read.
October ____	Dress up like a book character and tell about your character orally. This should be well rehearsed. A form will come home with your child to help him/her organize the oral presentation; however the child <u>should not</u> read from this paper.
November ____	Choose a character from a book you have read. Describe why you are thankful for this character or for what they have done. Write a thank you note telling them why you are thankful. You may use any stationary you choose. Just be sure it is a well written thank you note explaining to your WHY you are thankful for them.
January ____	Design a book jacket. A form will be sent home to explain this project. Again, BE CREATIVE!
February ____	After reading your book, you will construct a poster that advertises your book. Your job is to create an advertisement that will convince others to read your book. Be sure to tell the title and author of your book.
March ____	Design a puppet to illustrate a character from your favorite book. BE creative! Use any materials you choose and any type of puppet. The only requirement is that this is CHILD made!
April ____	Choosing a book of your choice, make a Shoe box scene/diorama. Use a box no smaller than a shoe box. Choose a scene, chapter, or theme from the book. Illustrate the scene in the box with 3-D props or pictures.
May ____	Write a book report. This should be written in the child's best handwriting and be thorough. A form will come home for this project.
